



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When looking to start a project, one of the most important things to have is the right people to do the job. That is often also one of the most difficult things to accomplish. For a person to be "right for the job," there has to be a combination of qualifications, skills,

availability and, the thing that makes is all possible, willingness. The best qualified people in the world make no difference whatsoever if they are not willing to do the job. They will sit around and wait for someone else to step up to the plate. In the long run, they will simply sit there and say, as the old saying goes (so I'm told!), "Let George do it." 

Mouse Tales: The St. Spyridon Church School Library Update

My Precious Children,

Hi! Happy Valentines Day! It's me, Spero! Today, I am here to chat with all of my little ones. I just have to tell you that I love the color red. It is very colorful and festive, just like me. Red is used in all of the important holidays like the poinsettias at Christmas, eggs at Easter and hearts on Valentine's Day. In fact, my vest is red to remind me all through the year of these special days.

> Well, now that I shared my feelings about the color red, on to a special thought for Valentine's Day. On Valentines Day you give cards to your special friend because you love them? The Bible tells us that our Heavenly Father loves us unconditionally, for He calls us His children. You remember to say, "I love you," to others, but <u>everyday</u> we can tell our Heavenly Father, "I love you," in prayer. For Valentine's Day, you will make special gifts for those that you love, but God gave us the greatest gift of all: His son, Jesus. So, not only on Valentines Day, but also on everyday of the year, let us continue to show our love to others, for our love comes from God.

Okay, now that I shared that special thought, on to our lesson for February (I have so...o. much to share with you this month!) My recommended video for this month is, "The Flip-Flop Shop." It is about sharing our feelings. Mr. Bump arrives at the Flip-Flop Shop with an unusual delivery: an armload of "mood boxes." As each of the different boxes are opened, everyone starts acting very strange. With feelings of sadness, laughter, crying, and joy, these different emotions have the group puzzled unil they start to understand where their feelings come from and what they mean. Sharing our feelings can be very powerful, but you must also learn to put a lid on them. One of the children shares her feelings about her best friend. A friend is very special even when you and your friend do not agree. You still have that special bond that is sticky just like glue no matter what happens your friend will make you happy because you love each other.

My precious little ones, have you ever had your friend move away? It hurts, but because you love someone, you can picture them in your mind and they are always close in your heart. Mary Lou ends with a message that our Heavenly Father loves us and cares about us not matter how we are feeling. He wants to live in our hearts so that we never feel alone. We can always talk to him in prayer and tell him about our feelings or anything else that we chose. He is always there to help us and to listen. So today if we just let Him, He will make us feel very special and loved.

Gheronda's Corner

Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Do good, be rich in good works, be generous and willing to share." (1 Tim. 6:18)

St. Paul offers a variety of practical advice to Timothy and the church he is responsible for in the chapter 6 of his letter. But much of his advice touches on the

Christian's attitude toward wealth and his use of it. A Christian should be content to have the necessities of life. It is dangerous to want to become wealthy: "The love of money is the root of all evils" (verse 10).

St. Paul does not, however, teach that money itself is evil, or that Christians cannot be rich. Verses 17 to 19 are addressed to wealthy Christians, instructing them in the right use of their wealth. Yes, wealth has its dangers, but the wealth of this world also offers a way to lay up eternal wealth, if it is used properly and generously.

It Says "Do Good, Be Rich In Good Works." Question: Which Works Are Good?

Those works are good, which are done according to God's will. We perform good works, if we, with good intention, do those things which please God, and abstain from those displeasing Him.

So, which are the principal good works?

1) Prayer, by which we keep in communion with God. 2) Fasting and self-denial, by which we restrain ourselves -from sin and evil inclinations. 3) Almsgiving, by which are understood all works of mercy, which we do to our neighbor as an outcome and proof of our dutiful love for him.

How many kinds of works of mercy are there?

Two: Spiritual and Corporeal.

Which are called spiritual works of mercy?

Those that are done for the good of the soul of our neighbor; namely: 1) To correct sinners; 2) to counsel the doubtful; 3) to instruct the ignorant; 4) to comfort the afflicted; 5) to forgive offences; 6) to bear wrongs patiently; 7) to pray for the living and the dead.

Which are called corporeal works of mercy?

Those that are done for the temporal welfare of our

fellow-men. They are: 1) To feed the hungry; 2) to give drink to the thirsty; 3) to clothe the naked; 4) to harbor pilgrims or strangers; 5) to visit the prisoners; 6) to visit the sick; 7) to bury the dead.

Are all works that are good in themselves acceptable to God?

No; only those are acceptable to God and will be rewarded by Him, which are done in the state of grace and a good intention; that is, in order to please God, or because it is His Holy Will.

Can anyone be saved without good works?

No: God rewards everyone according to his works. It is not enough for a Christian to abstain from evil in order to be saved; he is also obliged to perform good works. "....faith without works is dead." (James 2:20)

"Be generous and willing to share." (1 Timothy 6: 18) Beloved, our religion—that is Christianity—is a religion of caring and sharing with others.

Sundays of Preparation

Before Great Lent (Fast) begins, our Church prescribes for the faithful a period of preparation. *The Great Fast begins this year on Monday February 23.*

The first Sunday of the Triodion and preparation this year is February 1st, the Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee. From this parable we learn the power of humble prayer, *humility*. Read Luke 18:10-14.

The second Sunday of preparation (February 8th), is called the Sunday of the Prodigal Son or the *Loving Father*. This parable is a picture of repentance (the younger son) of forgiveness, of envy (the older brother), and of God's love. Read Luke 15:11-32.

The third preparatory Sunday February 1th, is Meat Fare Sunday. The Gospel lesson for this Sunday (February 15th), Matt. 25:31-46, describes the Second Coming of the Lord and the Last Judgement.

The theme of Cheese Fare Sunday (also called the Sunday of Forgiveness), February 22nd, the last Sunday before Great Lent/Fast begins, is the expulsion from Paradise and ways to regain it: to forgive, to observe the laws of fasting humbly, to "Lay up treasures in heaven and not on earth. Read Matt. 6:14-21.

Every Orthodox Christian is called upon to prepare himself during this pre-lenten period of four Sundays for the GREAT FAST which this year begins on Monday, FEBRUARY 23rd.

Commitment Sunday: "Building Toward the Future"

On Sunday, January 18, 2004, an exciting event was held at Holy Trinity Church: Commitment Sunday. Originally scheduled for December 14, but postponed due to snow, it was a day for learning about and committing to those things necessary for the life and future of the parish.

Special emphasis was placed on two key areas needed which are crucial to the present financial support of the community: **Stewardship** and the **Festival**. An update was also provided on the progress of the **Vision** Committee as they continue to carry out the wishes of the General Assembly in making plans for the future of Holy Trinity Church.

In addition to the exciting "pep rally" style presentations, a highlight of the meeting came via a remarkable and inspiring demonstration of commitment from the Holy



Trinity GOYA. The officers presented a check for \$5,000 to be reserved for the new church building and as a sign that the youth are not just the future of our Church, but an important, vibrant and dedicated part of the present.

Highlights from the Vision Committee Report

Background: Where We Have Been

- On November 7, 1999, the General Assembly **unanimously adopted the Mission Statement**, Goals and Objectives for the community. All current work has been based on those foundations.
- The General Assembly then further discussed the Vision Committee report on the existing facilities and other options to meet the community goals and objectives.
- On November 5, 2000, the General Assembly set the direction for the future of the community by approving a motion "...to build at another location..."
- On October 20, 2002, the General Assembly approved \$30,000 in funding to conduct geo-technical studies and architectural work related to the Gass Road property (the primary choice at that time); the geo-technical costs (\$12,000) were related specifically to that site, but all of the architectural expenses (\$11,750) would be useful regardless of eventual site selection.

Review: What We Have Done

- The initial geo-technical report was inconclusive as to whether or not the Gass Road property was suitable.
 \$1,100 was expended and the choice was made to not spend further geo-technical monies on this property.
- Architectural work was begun, including preliminary conceptual studies (\$1,500) and development of a "Kit of Parts" master plan (\$5,500) as well as conceptual sketches (\$4,750). All work done can be used regardless of property selected, since the work was not site-specific, but rather based on the needs of the community.
- The "Kit of Parts" master plan was developed by Architect Christ Kamages and involved meetings with and input from all community groups and ministries.
- Conceptual studies and sketches based on the master plan clearly indicated the need for additional space at the Gass Road site; all attempts to negotiate with adjacent property owners for more land failed.
- Through various relationships with land brokers and agents, as well as efforts on the part of Vision Committee members, dozens of potential sites have been considered and, in some instances, offers were presented without success. (All offers are for exploratory purposes and subject to General Assembly approval.)

Plans: Where We Are Going


- The primary focus today is on two adjoining properties totaling 20+ acres along Reis Run Road; an offer on one of the properties has been made and negotiations continue; the adjoining site first requires a subdivision plan, which is currently under development by the owners. Expectations are positive for both properties.
- Once offers have been accepted, Special General Assembly vote and Metropolis approval will be sought.
- After property approval, fund-raising plans will be finalized and presented to the community
- The architectural "Kit of Parts" master plan and conceptual sketches will also be reviewed with the community.

Stewardship Committee





Holy Trinity Stewardship Committee Chairman Dr. Christ A. Balouris presented the case for Stewardship as **the primary means of support for the Holy Trinity community**. Information included the encouraging news of a **49% increase** in total Stewardship from 2000 to 2003. Despite that positive news, it was noted that 82% of our pledges are still at the \$500 level or below, so everyone was challenged to join the growth trend to make it possible to meet the goal of \$160,000 for 2004. Only then, he said, will we be able to **reduce our dependency on "outside" sources of income for our operating budget** and truly prepare for the future of Holy Trinity Church.

Vision Committee Chairman Gus Georgiadis reported on the background, work and present focus of the Vision Committee. The chart pictured at the right displayed the range of sites investigated in the committee's search for a property for a new church, as directed by the General Assembly decisions made between 1999 and 2002. **Special note was made of positive developments on a potential site on Reis Run Road.** [See report details on page 8.]

Festival Committee Co-Chairman Leo Loomis, along with committee member Bill Fiedler, used a large chart to present the various positions available for the 2004 Holy Trinity Greek Festival. While they expressed appreciation for all the workers, diners and supporters of the Festival, they placed a heavy emphasis on the need for positive commitments <u>now</u> for various "department" positions. It was also emphasized that while we are working toward not using the Festival income for daily expenses, it remains as an important source of funds for the future of our church. Their appeal was responded to with enthusiasm, as many people stepped forward to sign up for important positions. More are still available.



Υπηρξαν σόφοι, αλλα και αγιοι, υψιπετες και συγχρονως ρεαλιστες.Γι αυτο οι εκλεκτοτεροιτης σημερινης διανοησεως στρεφονται προς αυτους. Η τελευταια λεξη της ψυχολογιας ειναι τα ανθρωπολογικα τους διδαγματα. Μεγαλοι παιδαγωγοι τονιζουν χαρακτηριστικα:

Οι Πατερες δεν ησαν απλως διανοουμενοι. Υπηρξαν οι καλυτεροι συγγραφεις ποιοτικως, ηταν η αριστοκρατια του Πνευματος. Απο τον ογκο των προβληματων του ανθρωπου εξελεξαν τα ανωτερα και αυτα επεδιωξαν να λυσουν. Ειτε γραφοντες, ειτε ομιλουντες, ενα πραγμα συνεχως τονίζαν, οτι ο ανθρωπος δεν πρεπει ν αφησει τον εαυτο του να μενει εκει οπου τωρα μενει. Οι Πατερες πηραν τον ανθρωπο απο εκει που τον αφησαν οι αλλοι σοφοι του κοσμου, για να τον οδηγησουν εκει που δεν φανταζονταν οι αλλοι. Οι Πατερες πονεσαν τον ανθρωπο και χαριν της ευτυχιας του καταναλωσαν ολη τη ζωη τους.

Μερικες απο τις αποψεις τους για την αξια και τα προβληματα του ανθρωπου θα ακουσουμε στη συνεχια.

Η αξια του ανθρωπου

Πολλα εχουν να πουν οι Τρεις Ιεραρχες στον συγχρονο ανθρωπο. Αρχιζουν απο ενα βαθυ θαυμασμο και απο μια απεραντη αγαπη προς τον ανθρωπο. Καθε σχετικη λεξη τους ειναι γεματη νοημα και ουσια. Ας ακουσουμε τον Χρυσοστομο:

Ανθρωπος εστι το περισπουδαστον του Θεου καν δουλος η, ουκ εστι μοι ευκατοφρονητος...καν εις η, ανθρωπος εστι, δι ον ουρανος ετανυσθη και ηλιος φαινει και σεληνη τρεχει και απρ εξεχυθη και πηγαι βρυουσι και θαλαττα ηπλωθη και προφηται επεμφθησαν και νομος εδοθη. Και τι δη παντα λεγειν; δι ον ο μονογενης Υιος του Θεου ανθρωπος εγενετο. Ο Δεσποτης μου εσφαγη και το αιμα αυτου εξεχεεν υπερ ανθρωπου.

Ο Μ. Βασιλειος συμβουλευει τον ανθρωπο της καθε εποχης και του λεει: Εξετασον σεαυτον τις ει, γνωθι σεαυτου την φυσιν, οτι θνητον μεν σου το σωμα, αθανατος δε η ψυχη...Υπερορα σαρκος, παρεπχεται γαρ επιμελου ψυχης, πραγματος αθανατου.

Ομως, υπαρχουν ανθρωποι σε καθε εποχη, και στη δικη μας, που αντιστρεφουν τα πραγματα ολη τους τη φροντιδα και τη μεριμνα την εξαντλουν για το σωμα, και με την ψυχη η ελαχιστα ασχολουνται η την αγνοουν πληρως.

Ο Μ. Βασιλειος λεει οτι αυτοι δεν διαφερουν καθολου απο εκεινους που ασχολουνται επιμελως με καποια οργανα, αλλα αδιαφορουν τελειως για την τεχνη η οποια δι αυτων ενεργει.

Το βαθυτερο νοημα του ανθρωπου

Πολλοι και συμερα, οπως παντοτε, εκτιμουν τους αλλους αναλογα με τη θεση τους, το επαγγελμα, τα αξιωματα, τα πλουτη, τα πνευματικα και σωματικα χαρισματα, τις ποικιλες ικανοτητες τους.

Σ αυτους οπως και σ ολους μας, οι Τρεις Ιεραρχες δινουν και σημερα το μετρο της ορθης αξιολογυσεως των ανθρωπων, οταν λεγουν οτι η βαθυτερη αξια ενος ανθρωπου, η κατα Θεον αξια του, εγκειται, οχι τοσο στα εξωτερικα χαρισματα η επιτευγματα του, οσο κυριως στην αρετη του, της οποιας βαθρο αποτελει ο φοβος του Θεου.

Η εσφαλμενη αυτη των πολλων κριση για τους ανθρωπους γινεται γιατι υπαρχει αμυθητος εν ανθρωποις πλανη γυρω απο τα ποια ειναι τα

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πραγματικα αγαθα της ζωης.

Ετσι π.χ. λεει ο Μ. Βασιλειος, πολλοι τα μεν αγαθα, οταν επιμονα η, κακα νομιζουσι τα δε κακα δια την προσιουσαν αυτοις ηδονην ως αγαθα μεταδιωκουσι.

Κρινουν δηλ, οι ανθρωποι τα πραγματα απο το αν τους προκαλουν εδω και τωρα ευχαριστηση η δυσαρεσκεια, και αποφευγοντας αυτα που τους δυσαρεστουν, επιδιωκουν ως αγαθα εκεινα που τους ευχαριστουν κατα την παρουσα στιγμη.

Αλλα υπαρχουν, λενε οι Τρεις Ιεραρχες, αγαθα που για να τα αποκτησει κανεις στο μελλον πρεπει τωρα να κοπιασει, να υποφερει, να εργαστει σκληρα. Τειοιο π.χ. ειναι το αγαθο της παιδειας, της οποιας αι μεν ριζαι πικραι, ο δε καρπος γλυκυς. Τετοιο ειναι και το υψιστο αγαθο, ο Θεος, και η Βασιλεια Του, που για να το απολαυσει κανεις δει (αυτον) διελθειν δια πολλων θλιψεων ουδεις, αλλωστε μη πληγεις εν αγωσι μηδε κονισαμενος στεφανουται.

Κριτικη και προσωπικη ευθυνη

Συνηθως οι ανθρωποι ανζητουν το κακο στους αλλους, οχι στον εαυτο τους.

Αναζητουν να βρουν αναμεσα στους αλλους εξιλαστηρια θυματα για τα κακως εχοντα.

Δεν δεχονται τη δικη τους προσωπικη ευθυνη. Προς αυτους οι Τρεις Ιεραρχες τονιζουν οτι ο ανθρωπος πρεπει να εξαντλει την αυστηροτητα του προς τον εαυτο του (οχι προς τους αλλους, προς τους οποιους πρεπει να ειναι επιεικης) και οτι η ριζα του κακου και η ουσια του βρισκεται μεσα μας.

Γι αυτο απευθυνονται και σημερα στον ανθρωπο και του λενε: Μη...το κακον εξωθεν περισκοπει. Αυτο βρισκεται μεσα σου, στη διαστροφη βουληση σου. Εκει πρεπει κυριως να το αναζητησεις και να το πολεμησεις.

Σ αυτους που και συμερα, οπως τοτε, στα χρονια τους, ταυτιζουν τον ανθρωπο με την κακια του και στρεφουν την πολεμικη τους προσωπικα κατα του αμαρτωλου, τονιζουν την αναγκη διακρισεως του αμαρτωλου απο την αμαρτια η την κακια του. Ο ανθρωπος, λενε, σ οποιαδηποτε ηθικη κατασταση κι αν βρισκεται, ειναι αξιος συμπαθειας και αγαπης, ως παιδι του Θεου και αδελφος μας η αμαρτια η κακια του ειναι αποβλητη.

Παυσαι λεει ο Μ. Βασιλειος να περιεργαζεσαι και να εξεταζεις το αλλοτριον αρρωστημα επι την οικειαν ερευναν στρεφε σου το ομμα της ψυχης. Η κριτικη σου εχει αξια οταν γινεται αυτοκριτικη που συνεπαγεται τη βελτιωση σου.

Ο ανθρωπος στο κεντρο της διδασκαλιας των 3 Ιεραρχων

Αυτα οι Τρεις Ιεραρχες δεν τα σκεφτηκαν μονουν, δεν τα διδαξαν απλως. Τα εζησαν με τη βαθυτερη συνεπεια. Και οχι μονο εζησαν ως αληθινοι ανθρωποι, αλλα και αγωνιστηκαν με ολες τις δυναμεις τους για την ανυψωση του ανθρωπου στην αληθινη του αξια.

Ειναι πλανη να νομιζουμε οτι ασχοληθηκαν μονο με αφηρημενα δογματα, με την θεωριας.

Ο σκοπος τους ειναι συγκεκριμενος και πρακτικος.

Οι μεγαλοι αγωνες τους ειναι κυριως για την αναμορφωση της θειας εικονας στον ανθρωπο. Γι αυτο δε δισταζουν να στιγματισουν δριμυτατα και χωρις οικτο τον ανθρωπινο εκπεσμο, την απανθρωπη πλεονεξια. Αλλα συγχρονως ο ανθρωπισμος τους εγκαινιαζει την πρωτοπορεια στο εργο της φιλανθρωπιας.

Ετσι ο Μ. Βασιλειος, οπως και οι αλλοι δυο μεγαλοι επεισαν ανθρωπους οντας, ανθρωπων μη καταφρονειν. Αυτος ασπαζομενος ακομη και τους λεπρους της Βασιλειαδος, εγινε ευγλωττη και σιωπηρη παραινεση και δειγμα της περι του ανθρωπου φιλοσοφιας.

Αυτοι περισσοτερο απο καθε αλλο αντιμετωπισαν τον ανθρωπο κατα εναν τροπο ακριβη και υπευθυνο.

Δεν τον μελετησαν μονο με τη θεωρια, τον βοηθυσαν και με την πραξη. Η ζωντανη και ολο κληρωμενηπροσωπικοτητα τους περιελαβε τον ανθρωπο ος συνολο. Τον ανθρωπο με ολες τις αξιες του: παιδεια, τεχνη, εργασια, κοινωνικοτητα, οικογενιεα, πατριδα.

Αγαπησαν ο, τι ωραιο και αληθινο υπαρχει στον ανθρωπο. Γι αυτο ο λογος τους ηταν και παραμενει παντα, και σημερα, μεστος και ρωμαλεος και επικαιρος.

Μεσα στους ταραγμενους καιρους μας, ας κανουμε κτημα μας τα πατρωα και θεια παιδευματα τους κι ας τους αφησουμε γυρω μας και στον κοσμο ολοκληρο, να γινουν αυτοι οδηγοι μας, οι παιδευται και φωστηρες των ψυχων μας.

Του ζήτησα αγάπη, κι Αυτός μου έδωσε προβληματικά άτομα να βοηθώ.


Του ζήτησα χάρες, κι Αυτός μου έδωσε ευκαιρίες να εκμεταλλευτώ.
