Discovering the Deep Heart

Sin can never attract the blessing of God, so unless we keep our hearts alive and alert, we will eventually become strangers to Him.

ow awesome, yet how hard it is to stand before the judgment of God! And it will be especially so on the day of our departure from this world. Our strength at that dread hour will come from steadfast loyalty to the Lord during our earthly sojourn having preferred Him above all in times of temptation. If we are faithful to the Lord He will be with us not just for a time, or for the duration of our temptations, but for all eternity.

Geronda, I want to remain faithful to God in all things, but sometimes I stray. Why?

When we begin to take for granted the grace which God gives us at the beginning and the state of heart that this inspires, this is the beginning of a slide into negligence which leads us back into the ways of the world. We begin to ignore and forsake our heart; we no longer discern the change that the presence of the Spirit of God has wrought in us.

We then turn to rules and regulations to make up for our loss, and it is only a matter of time before we become self-satisfied in our observance of them, perhaps even believing that our salvation is thereby guaranteed. And since we no longer possess the treasure of divine consolation, we easily slip even further down to a way of life that is unworthy of our calling. But it need not be like this.

How can I avoid this?


Unless we endeavor to live within our

heart, we remain blind to our untamed passions. The inclinations of our heart and mind remain beyond our control. We sin whether we want to or not. Sin can never attract the blessing of God, so unless we keep our hearts alive and alert, we will eventually become strangers to Him. The Scriptures say that "the heart is deep." God honors this "deep heart" of man. All heaven hearkens to a deep heart thirsty for God and ready to receive Him. But if our heart is indifferent to God, we are worth little more than dust and ashes. We must attend to our heart and cultivate it. for the hidden man of the heart is very precious in the sight of God. May God give us such a heart, a deep heart that is capable of divine and spiritual sensation!

That sounds beautiful. How do I enter my "deep heart?"

We learn to enter into our "deep heart" through personal prayer in our rooms and attendance at church services. And if we take courage and enter therein, we shall behold the great miracle of the union of our life with God's Life, for this takes place in the heart of man. Indeed, the aim of our entire ascetic struggle—our fasts, vigils and prayers—is to reveal the heart, to unearth it.

Above all we must practice obedience and live in the humility that comes of doing someone else's will. Obedience is a shortcut to the heart, because humility detects and locates the heart and brings it to the surface. It can

then be cleansed of sin and set free to invoke the Name of the Lord unto salvation. And this prepares it for the indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

Are there tools I can use to do this?

If we are to cultivate the soil of our hearts we will first need a plow, and our plow must be the Cross of Christ. This will lead us into obedience to His word and we will take up our own cross. No one can carry the Cross of Christ.

We bear our small personal cross in obedience to Christ's commandment. This cross is the pain and sacrifice involved in freeing the heart from passionate attachments and secret deceits, that it may run freely after its beloved God and call upon Him. It will have room for nothing but a yearning for God by which to invoke His Name. The one desire of the heart is to be one with Him Who joined Himself to our nature, bringing into it all His divine virtues so that we might become "partakers of the divine nature." Thus, by taking up our small cross, we inherit the life hidden in His great Cross. *

THE GREAT SECRET OF MARRIAGE

Marriage is major vehicle for the Gospel's remaking of your heart from the inside out and your life from the ground up.

The reason that marriage is so painful and yet wonderful is because it is a reflection of the Gospel, which is painful and wonderful at once. The Gospel is this: we are more sinful and flawed in ourselves than we ever dared believe, yet at the very same time we are more loved and accepted in Jesus Christ than we ever dared hope. This is the only kind of relationship that will really transform us. Love without truth is sentimentality; it supports and affirms us but keeps us in denial about our flaws. Truth without love is harshness; it gives us information but in such a way that we cannot really hear it. God's saving love in Christ, however, is marked by both radical truthfulness about who we are and yet also radical, unconditional commitment to us.

The hard times of marriage drive us to experience more of this transforming love of God. But a good marriage will also be a place where we experience more of this kind of transforming love at a human level.

This is the great secret! Through the Gospel, we get both the power and the pattern for the journey of marriage.
